With AACHEN WiFi you can enjoy free high-speed Internet everywhere around the Aachener Dom and Town Hall. Just enter code and surf 24 hours.

AACHEN WiFi allows you to surf the internet via wifi in large parts of the city. All you need is a free code by which you can be online for 24 hours. These codes can be found in many shops, restaurants and bars in the city center. You can find a detailed overview of the ever-growing partner network at www.aachenwifi.de. Through this portal you can go online for half an hour a day even without any code.


Conference Venue and City Bus


Conference Dinner

The City of Aachen

The city of Aachen, also known as Bad Aachen is a spa town in North Rhine-Westphalia, Germany. Geographically, Aachen is the westernmost city of Germany, located along its borders with Belgium and the Netherlands in the middle of Europe. About 260.000 citizens are living in Aachen and Aachen covers an area of 168.83 km².

The history of Aachen extends over more than 1300 years and this city was a favored residence of Charlemagne, and later the place of coronation of the German kings. Apart from the Aachen Cathedral, there is the city hall or the historic city with a lot of museums.

Aachen Cathedral



The Cathedral of Aachen is one of the most famous examples of occidental architecture and part of the UNESCO World Heritage. It is the coronation church of more than 30 German kings, highest building for 200 years north of the Alps and a major pilgrimage church.

Aachen City Hall

The city hall is a gothic building which was built in the 14th century upon the foundations of the ruined palace of Charlemagne. The front is decorated by 50 statues of German rulers of which 31 kings were crowned in Aachen. Visitors may take a look at the Coronation hall and the gothic and baroque interior.

Elisa Fountain



Constructed in 1827, the Elisa Fountain (Elisenbrunnen) is the symbol of the spa town of Aachen. Despite its striking scent, the thermal water is said to have healing effects and may be tasted by anyone. The names of various famous visitors can be found on several marble plaques.

Aachen Cathedral Treasury

With its sacral art treasures from the late Antique, Carolingian, Ottonian and Staufian epoch, the Cathedral Treasury in Aachen is regarded as the most important ecclesiastical treasury north of the Alps. Among others, one may admire the famous “Bust of Charlemagne”.

Ponttor / Marschiertor



Pont- and Marschiertor are the last two remaining gates of the original city wall of Aachen and belong to the strongest remaining gates of Western Europe. They were built during the 13th and 14th century and are still an impressive view for visitors, despite missing their actual wall.

RWTH Aachen University

RWTH Aachen University (Rheinisch-Westfälische Technische Hochschule Aachen). It was founded on 10 October 1870. In recent years, RWTH Aachen was chosen as one of nine German Universities of Excellence for its future concept RWTH 2020: “Meeting Global Challenges”.

Today, RWTH Aachen is with its 260 institutes in nine faculties among the leading European scientific and research institutions. In the winter semester of 2014/15, 42298 students in 144 curricular were registered, including 6395 international students from more than 120 countries. The most popular study programs are mechanical engineering, medicine, electrical engineering, computer science, economics, and architecture.



The Computer Science Department was established in 1971 as part of the Faculty of Mathematics, Computer Science and Natural Sciences. The department is characterized by the combined expertise of 30 research units, closely linked to engineering and many other research institutes.

The campus of RWTH Aachen covers 250 ha. It is mainly located in the north-western part of Aachen. There are three core areas – midtown, Hörn, and Melaten. The Main Building and the SuperC are at the midtown campus, whereas the computer science building is at the Hörn campus.
